## Advanced Placement Exams

If your child is currently in an AP course, please be sure they register to take the AP Exam this spring. While there are many indicators that impact a student's ability to graduate from college, taking and passing an AP test with a 3 or higher greatly influences a student's chances of graduating from college. Additionally, scoring well on an AP exam can help students earn college credit for their high school class, saving a significant amount of tuition. Scoring at least a 3 on an AP exam will also make students eligible for AP honors, and many colleges seek students with this status.

Online registration will take place Dec. 5-Feb. 21. To register, students should visit [www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/370470](http://www.TotalRegistration.net/AP/370470). All questions must be answered, and registration is not complete until students have printed confirmation provided at the end. Exams are \$99 and discounted \$25 per exam for students taking multiple exams. Students on free/reduced lunch will receive a discounted price of \$30 per exam.
