## Local Scholarships Now Available

Local scholarships are now available for Broken Arrow High School seniors. The deadline to apply for these scholarships is **March 6, 2020**. ## Senior CPR Credit

## Oklahoma's Promise

Oklahoma's Promise is an opportunity for your child to earn a college tuition scholarship. To enroll in the Oklahoma's Promise program, your child must be an Oklahoma resident, enrolled in 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, or 10<sup>th</sup> grade in an Oklahoma high school, and a student whose parents earn \$55,000 or less per year. Special income provisions may apply to children adopted from certain court-ordered custody and children in the custody of court-appointed legal guardians or families receiving Social Security disability and death benefits. Upon completing the program's requirements, your child will earn tuition at an Oklahoma public two-year college or four-year university, a portion of tuition at an accredited Oklahoma private college or university, or a portion of tuition for approved programs at Oklahoma public technology centers.
