

High School Enrollment Conferences Feb. 11 and 20

Enrollment conferences will take place from 3 p.m. to 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Feb. 11 and Thursday, Feb. 20.

In preparation for those two nights, students are in the process of choosing their courses for the coming school year during their advisory class. English, math, history and science teachers will make course recommendations for each of their students. These teacher recommendations will serve as the beginning point for students and parents to evaluate, discuss and make the final decision about course requests for next year.
