ASVAB Exam

The Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) is a multiple-aptitude battery test that measures developed abilities and helps predict future academic and occupational success in the military. This exam can also help students not interested in the military with career exploration.

The BeyondBA (College and Career) office will host the test on Tuesday, Nov. 17 at 7:40 a.m. This test is free, only open to Juniors and Seniors and will be given in the Broken Arrow High School media center. This exam is approximately three hours long. Students will need to sign up before the test date, and space is limited. Permission slips need to be returned to Mrs. Miler in the College and Career Office by Friday, Nov. 13.

Concurrent Enrollment

Through the concurrent enrollment program, junior and senior students can attend college courses during the school day through TCC at NSU-BA and receive both high school credit and college credit at a reduced cost. Classes start on Jan. 19, 2021. Juniors can receive a tuition waiver for up to six credit hours a semester and seniors can receive a tuition waiver for up to 18 credit hours divided however they want for the summer, fall and spring semesters. Transportation is provided by Broken Arrow Public Schools to and from the NSU-BA campus. To enroll, students should meet with high school counselor to verify graduation credits and complete the [online form](#).
